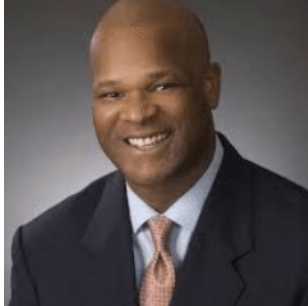


Dwight Boykins



Dwight was born in Houston and raised with six brothers in the South Union neighborhood. His modest upbringing taught him values of family, humility and respect for one's elders. A product of Houston public schools, Dwight's desire to be of service to others was informed at an early age.

Council Member Boykins is a strong and active advocate for District D. His service to his district has resulted in \$45.6 million in infrastructure improvements and \$112 million in economic development. Business development, public safety, infrastructure, and job creation are key to Dwight's district policies.

He currently serves as Chair of the Ethics, Elections & Council Governance Committee and on the following committees: Budget and Fiscal Affairs; Subcommittee on Debt Financing and Pensions; Regulation and Neighborhood Affairs; and Housing and Community Development.

Dwight previously served as a Commissioner of ReBuild Houston and remains an advocate for the improvement of the city's street infrastructure to address drainage and flooding in District D and across the city. He is on the Board of Directors for the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, a Senior Fellow of the American Leadership Forum (ALF), and a former board member of the Houston-Galveston Area Council/Transportation Policy Council.

After earning his BBA in Marketing from Texas Southern University, Dwight worked in the banking and credit union industry, later serving as Marketing Manager for the Firefighters Credit Union. Dwight and his wife of 29 years, Genora, are active members of Windsor Village United Methodist Church.
