Dr. Kendall Baker is a Houston native and was raised in Fontaine Place in northeast Houston. After graduating from Forest Brook High School he started working for the City of Houston. He attended several local colleges and currently holds a Doctorate of Divinity degree from Kingdom Builders Bible Seminary and an honorary Ph. D in Pulpit Communications from Covenant International University.

Pastor Baker retired from the City of Houston after 29 years of public service. His last position was a Division Manager for the

Administration and Regulatory

Affairs Department, Operations Division, 311 Help and Information Center. There he served as a manager, responsible for oversight of staff that resolved 2 million requests annually. He worked in various management capacities in other departments including the Office of the Mayor, Public Works & Engineering Department Consumer Affairs Division and the 911 Emergency Network. During a lay-off under the Parker Administration, Dr. Baker fought to save the jobs of Latino employees. Dr. Baker has been a lifetime brother and friend to the Latino community.

Pastor Baker pursued the call to ministry while working for the city. From 2012 to 2014, Pastor Baker served as the inaugural Chairman of the Houston Police and Clergy Alliance. He is a current member of the Houston Ministers Against Crime, serving for over 20 years. Dr. Baker served as the Director of Field Operations for the Houston Area Pastor Council, a group of non-denominational, inter-racial coalition of senior pastors. He has one young daughter.
